International Faculty Highlight: Maria Villalobos-Buehner



I am a World Language, ESL, Bilingual Education and Spanish professor at Rider University from Colombia, South America. I arrived to the United States 16 years ago, and I have been a language teacher for 26 years in different countries such as Colombia, England, and the U.S. I have a master's degree in

Linguistics from England and a Ph.D. in Education from Michigan State University. My research explores issues of language learning motivation and language identity in abroad programs and in regular language classrooms.

My first experience abroad was during a home stay program in Michigan and since then, I have been traveling the world. Study abroad sojourns are valuable experiences in my life because they not only opened a myriad of opportunities at academic and professional levels, but they also took me through a journey of meaningful personal transformation and discoveries. I was able to more clearly explore my identity as a Colombian.

I am a full supporter of abroad experiences and I am always looking for opportunities to be part of new programs. At the moment, I am working on an initiative together with CIE to offer a Spanish 101 course with a week abroad component in Costa Rica. This course will allow the students to learn the language and apply their knowledge in real life scenarios. It will also have a social component during which students will be able to support literacy in a school in San José. I am very excited about this opportunity and I cannot wait to be part of future life transforming events.


International Student Highlight: Andrea Salazar – Ecuador
