

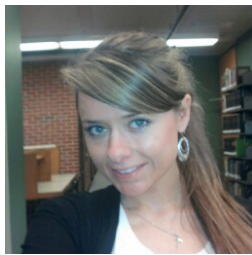

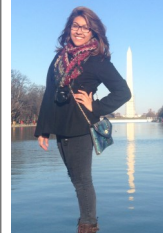
Fall Study Abroad Scholarship Recipients

Daisy Rivadeneira will be attending CAPA London with a Diversity Abroad Scholarship.

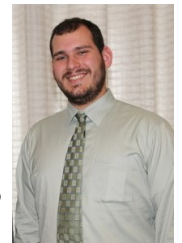
Andrew Corkery will also be studying at CAPA London with the help of the School of Liberal Arts Study Abroad Scholarship.
