

The minute I stepped off the plane, I was completely immersed in a culture so different from the one I'm used to. Although it was daunting at first to live with people I didn't know from all over the world, I quickly made many friends who were all there for similar reasons. In my Thai Language and Culture class, I learned about Thai history and culture, as well as how to speak enough Thai to ask for and give directions, order food, and bargain while shopping. Founded in 1888, Mahidol University is one of the oldest educational institutions in Thailand. The university supports a student body of over 19,000, and with over 2,600 faculty, the teacher student ratio is the best of any university in Thailand.



Mahidol University International College (MUIC) was established to deliver English-taught degree programs that embody the finest standards possible to a diverse population of full-time students from Thailand and around the world. Programs in the social sciences, business, and tourism management stand alongside course offerings in health and natural sciences. In addition to these, the College offers general education courses in foreign languages and humanities.

The MUIC is located at Mahidol University's Salaya campus on 500 acres of managed land, including parklands and sports facilities. Salaya is a thriving campus town and residential suburb of Bangkok. The center of Bangkok is only 20km (or 12.4 miles) from campus.
